SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION TO SUBMIT THE FISCAL YEAR 2025 CONTINUUM OF CARE GRANTS APPLICATIONS TO THE PARTNERSHIP HOME HOMELESS COALITION IN RESPONSE TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT’S COC HOMELESS ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS, FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING AND RAPID REHOUSING PROGRAMS

COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED

It is requested that the Commissioners Court consider the submission of the FY 2025 Continuum of Care Grants Applications to the Partnership Home Homeless Coalition for the continuation and possible expansion of the Community Development Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing Programs.

BACKGROUND

The Partnership Home Homeless Coalition annually conducts the local competition providing funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, through the Continuum of Care competitive grants for homeless assistance programs providing permanent supportive housing and rapid rehousing.

Community Development has historically received funding through this program to fund between eleven to fifteen programs in partnership with local nonprofit agencies providing assistance with rent and supportive services to around 1,000 local individuals overcoming homelessness. These programs are operated by local nonprofit subrecipients. Community Development is seeking permission to request grant funding in the amount up to \$6,000,000 through the Continuum of Care competition for the continuation and possible expansion of Community Development Permanent Supportive Housing and Rapid Rehousing programs.

The grant applications are for one-year funding and eligible for annual renewal. The local competition grant deadline is anticipated to be late Summer 2025 and is dependent on the NOFO announcement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. A quick turnaround is typically required for applications.

FISCAL IMPACT

The grant requests are anticipated to be between \$5,000,000 and \$6,000,000. The required match is generally twenty-five percent (25%) of the expended total program budget. Historically, the costs of administering these grants are paid with CoC and Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Funded nonprofit agencies are responsible to meet the majority of match requirements.
