SUBJECT: PERMISSION TO TAKE BIDS-RFPS

COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED

It is requested that the Commissioners Court grant permission to take Bids/RFPs for the following:

a. Annual Contract for Preventative Maintenance and Repair of Conveyor System

Estimated Value - \$33,000.00
Funding is available in the FY 2025 budget.

This contract is used to provide preventative maintenance and repair of the conveyor system located at the Tarrant County Corrections Center. The conveyor system is utilized to store and retrieve inmate property. Preventative maintenance includes, but is not limited to, checking trunnion for drive linkage engagement; checking wheels and hanger frames for damage; replacing belts; lubricating gear boxes, drive motors, wheels, linkage joints, pins holding hanger frame to drive linkage, and holes containing connector rods between upper and lower hanger frames; cleaning excess lubricant from wheels; clearing area under conveyor of any obstructions; and testing the entire conveyor system. This contract will be used by Facilities Management and the primary contact is Frank Lopez.

b. Purchase of Inseyets Online Pro and Unlimited Unlocks Subscription

Estimated Value - \$139,650.00
Funding is available in the FY 2025 budget.

This purchase covers Inseyets Pro and Unlimited Unlocks Subscription, the upgraded replacement for the existing Cellebrite Premium. It is a forensic tool used by the Digital Forensics and Technical Services team of the District Attorney's Office to assist with criminal investigations that aids in bypassing locked and encrypted mobile devices using software algorithms. Cellebrite handles a large variety of devices that use both the Apple iOS and the Android operating systems typically found on Samsung, LG, Google Pixel, and Motorola systems. Cellebrite is updating their software system this year to retire UFED 4PC and replace it with Inseyets. The functionality of the software will remain intact. The purchase will be used by the District Attorney's Office and the primary contact is Michael Weaver.

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c. Purchase of Firearms Range Target System

Estimated Value - \$115,000.00

Funding is available in the FY 2025 budget.

This contract is for the purchase and installation of a turning target system for conducting a variety of annual firearms training and qualifications required by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. This will be used by the Sheriff's Office and the primary contacts are Captain Jessica Brittain and Range Master Michael Nelson.

d. Annual Contract for Maintenance of Forward Looking Infrared Video Management System

Estimated Value - \$399,900.00

Funding has been requested in the FY 2026 budget.

This contract is for maintenance of the FLIR Enterprise Video Management System (cameras) installed at various Tarrant County buildings. This contract will be used by Facilities Management and the primary contact is Paul Patterson.
