**SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION TO ACCEPT GRANT YEAR 2024 URBAN AREA  
SECURITY INITIATIVE GRANT PROGRAM GRANT AWARD FROM THE  
OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, HOMELAND SECURITY DIVISION, TO  
SUPPORT THE TARRANT COUNTY ELECTION SECURITY  
ENHANCEMENT PROJECT**

**COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED**

It is requested that the Commissioners Court consider the acceptance of GY 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Homeland Security Grant Program grant award from the Office of the Governor (OOG), Homeland Security Division, to support the Tarrant County Election Security Enhancement Project.

**BACKGROUND**

The Office of the Governor is responsible for coordinating homeland security initiatives such as the UASI Grant Program. The UASI is awarded to states and urban areas to enhance the ability to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks, major disasters, and other emergencies.

Since 2004, Tarrant County has applied for and received funding through this grant program to support various projects related to emergency management.

Election security has become a priority for grant funding, and state and regional plans. Many urban areas that receive UASI funding are preparing election security projects in anticipation of it being a future grant requirement. The Tarrant County Election Security Project will reinforce the security of the Tarrant County Elections Office by implementing new security measures. These measures include installing shatter-resistant film for glass and creating a wall and door to separate the foyer and interior of the building. These security strategies have been identified by federal partners as potential solutions to weaknesses in the building's layout.

On March 19, 2024, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #142813, approved the submission of the GY 2024 UASI grant application to the OOG, Homeland Security Division, to support the Tarrant County Election Security Enhancement Project for the amount of #125,000.00.

With approval, grant funding in the amount of \$113,000.00 will be used to support physical security enhancements to the Tarrant County Elections Administration building. This project will attempt to harden the facility by installing shatter-resistant film on glass at the Tarrant County Elections Administration Building. Additionally, this project will fund the creation of a wall and door to separate the foyer and interior of the building.

The grant period is from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025. This is a one (1) year funding cycle.

The Budget and Risk Management Office has reviewed the statement of grant award.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The grant award is for \$113,000.00. Operating subsidy and match are not required. Indirect costs were not calculated for this grant.

**Statement of Grant Award (SOGA)**

The Statement of Grant Award is the official notice of award from the Office of the Governor (OOG).
