SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION TO ACCEPT A TREE GRANT PROGRAM AWARD FROM THE CITY OF FORT WORTH, FORESTRY DEPARTMENT, FOR FIFTEEN TREES TO BE PLACED ON THE RESOURCE CONNECTION CAMPUS

COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED

It is requested that the Commissioners Court consider the acceptance of a Tree Grant Program Award from the City of Fort Worth, Forestry Department, for fifteen trees to be placed at the Resource Connection campus.

BACKGROUND

The City of Fort Worth has promoted sound urban forestry practices since 1873 when the city charter declared it illegal to hitch a horse to a tree. The city hired its first arborist in the 1920s. Fort Worth is the oldest and longest-running Tree City USA in Texas, a designation the city first received in 1978.

The Forestry Department has two (2) grant programs to encourage the planting of trees in neighborhoods and is offering two (2) kinds of trees available in 3-inch diameter balled and burlapped trees and 10-15 gallon container-grown trees from the city's tree farm where they are grown from locally-collected seeds. The tree species are either native or well-adapted to the area and include several variations.

On July 16, 2024, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #143456, approved the submittal of a Tree Grant Program application to the City of Fort Worth, Forestry Department, for the request of fifteen (15) trees to be placed at the Resource Connection campus.

The minimum requirements include: completing a Tree Grant Application and site plan by September 15th of 2024 for each tree planting season; locating utility lines prior to receiving trees; planting trees within 24 hours of delivery; watering trees for a two-year period after planting; and meeting with a forester on-site during tree planting to ensure the trees are being planted correctly.

With approval, the Resource Connection campus will be awarded fifteen (15) trees to be placed at the campus. The City of Fort Worth will harvest, deliver, and install the trees when they are ready at the beginning of 2025. With the help of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension office, we've identified ideal locations within campus proper. The area includes an irrigation system to meet requirements and will require hand watering for some locations.

The Budget and Risk Management Department has reviewed this grant award.
